Dear Marlboro Township Residents

Recycling is an important part of our commitment as a municipality. It is not only environmentally responsible but enables the Township to receive grants and rebates which ultimately improve services and reduce costs for residents. The single biggest defining factor in our success is you. Resident participation and adherence to the schedule keeps our roads clean and safe and helps prevent pollutants from entering our Township's water bodies. I am proud of the work we have done. Use this official recycling calendar as a resource so we can continue to work together on this important effort. The Recycling Calendar and schedule updates are posted on the Township website.

One of the biggest challenges is collecting leaves curbside in a manner that provides residents the services they are accustomed to while adhering to NJDEP regulations and being mindful of public safety, flooding and the appearance and condition of our neighborhoods. It is important to note that when we schedule curbside collections, we do so with two unknowns; the date leaves will fall and the date of the first snowfall. Marlboro is a large town, consisting of approximately 14,000 residences and 300 miles of roadway within 32 square miles. The timing of leaves falling, the greater frequency of unpredictable and severe storms and earlier snowfalls all impact the timetable for collecting leaves.

An additional complicating factor is that we do have some contractors and even property owners, who, with no regard for the schedule, blow leaves into the street, leaving leaf debris in the gutters for months presenting multiple hazards. Leaves clog sewers, cause flooding, and create icing and treacherous road conditions. The presence of decomposing leaves on black top is an environmental hazard as it increases the phosphorus and nitrogen in stormwater runoff, resulting in algae blooms in waterways which can create toxins and harm aquatic life.

I can also relay the sentiment of your neighbors who take great pride in maintaining their own properties – they do not appreciate leaves piled in the streets and blowing around long after the fall season has ended.

With these points in mind, for 2022 we continue a hybrid piled leaf/ bagged pickup with some adjustments from last year. As noted above, we do not know when the leaves will fall or when our first snow will occur and for that reason our fall collection dates are noted as 'TBA". We need your cooperation to make this work:

- Visit www.marlboro-nj.gov and register for emails. Leaf collection dates will be announced via email and posted on the website in reaction to weather conditions and when the majority of the leaves fall.
- Do not place leaves or allow your contractor to place leaves curbside before the collection date for your zone is announced.
 We will give you time to get your leaves to the curb.

Bag as many leaves as possible. We will continue our free leaf bag distribution and, following the major fall collection, we ask that you bag leaves to keep our streets safe, clean and clear for snowplow operations.



We continue to strive to give the best service to our residents, balancing the necessities of public safety while adhering to State and County health

guidelines. Permits and services can be obtained online for many processes including bulk permits which can be done at any time from your home. Our tax payment drop box, open 24/7 can be used for all resident payments and documents that need to get to any municipal office. Within this calendar contains the answer to most of your recycling questions (see page 17 for 'How Do I Dispose of') and follow the quidelines set forth in this publication.

- Place debris on property near curb, not in street, no more than a week prior to first collection date in your zone.
- The Marlboro Office of Emergency Management (OEM) may cancel or postpone curbside collection due to weather conditions.
- Notice of changes and emergency updates are made via Township email blast, social media, SWIFT 911 Police calls, and on the webpage. Register for communication options on our website.

Public Works projects, whether recycling or roads, costs money. The good news is that due to our superior financial position and AAA bond rating we have been able to direct funding toward our roads, and under my Road Improvement Plan in 2018 and 2019 budget years alone, we allocated \$10 million towards road and drainage improvements which have had a dramatic and noticeable impact upon our community. Paving and repairing roadways is DPW's primary focus during the summer months. Therefore, no curbside pickup other than standard recycling is scheduled during that time.

Recycling is an important part of our Clean Communities Program with opportunities to volunteer. If you are interested in these or other volunteer opportunities, feel free to call my office 732-536-0200 x1200.

I thank you for being part of the work we are doing to keep our environment clean, our township safe, and maintain our quality of life.

AN IMPORTANT ENVIRONMENTAL MESSAGE

Marlboro Township remains committed to our local environment and the health and wellness of our residents. As part of our New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) Stormwater Permit, Marlboro Township is required to reduce the amount of pollutants, discharging into the Township's water bodies. Harmful examples range from roadside litter and debris, sediments from erosion. nutrients and insecticides from lawn treatments, bacteria and pathogens from failing septic systems, salts from de-icing activities, to detergents from vehicle washings. These are environmental threats that as a community, we are all responsible for. Reduction in pollution through the State of New Jersey will directly improve the health of our streams and supporting habitats, therefore improving the quality of life for our population. In an effort to maintain our commitment, the Township has adopted several ordinances relative to pet waste, litter, improper disposal of waste, wildlife feeding, yard waste collection program and non-permitted connections to the Township storm sewer systems. Please remember, rain water washes pollutants into storm drains that discharge into our streams and oceans! Everyone can do their part to prevent pollutants from entering our storm sewers:

 Follow the directions on your fertilizer bag, do not apply before it rains and use only when necessary. Use natural slow-release nitrogen fertilizers. Use a mulching mower to reduce the need for fertilizer. Practice Integrated Pest Management (IPM), focusing on longterm prevention of pests or their damage through techniques such as natural detergents, mechanical barriers, and use of resistant plant life varieties. Identify pest species before spraying and use natural pesticides whenever possible. If needed, target chemical pesticides sparingly.

- Use drought-resistant native plants in gardens and beds.
 They require less fertilizer and water thereby reducing the amount of polluted runoff getting to storm sewers.
- Dispose of pet waste by placing it in a bag and throwing in trash or flushing down toilet without bag. Animal waste contains coliform bacteria, which is harmful to our health.
- Recycle used oil at certified facilities and maintain your vehicle to prevent leaks.
- Take your car to a service center to change oil or antifreeze. If you do change your own fluids, do it in a garage so it's not exposed to rainwater and NEVER discard oil, gas or antifreeze into storm sewers.
- Take your car to a carwash where water gets treated and recycled, or use a natural biodegradable cleanser.
- Pick up litter on your property and put it in the trash. NEVER throw litter and debris directly into storm sewer, including cigarette butts. Trash in the storm drains not only pollutes our waterways but clogs our storm drains which exacerbates street flooding.
- Bag leaves in bio-degradable paper for pickup or mulch in place to prevent clogged storm sewers and excess nitrogen and phosphorus in run off.

Let's work together to keep our waters clean! If you see trash in the street, built up on storm grates or on the lawn please remember that it ends up somewhere: in our local creeks, streams, ponds, river and eventually the ocean. Make a difference, pick it up and reduce water pollution.

Protect our water and our environment.

The Marlboro Township Department of Public Works (DPW) is responsible for leaf, brush, and snow removal as well as general repair for over 730 named streets, covering over 200 miles of roadway, parking facilities, creation and placement of road signage, line striping and public information signs.

DID YOU KNOW?

DPW maintains over 200 acres of Township parks, playgrounds and recreation areas, as well as all vehicles and fuel for the Board of Ed, Water Utility, Fire Companies and First Aid Squads. DPW maintains all facilities including the Municipal Complex, the recycling yard, the Municipal Swim Club, Recreation Center, Public Library, Morganville Senior Center and all First Aid Squads. DPW in partnership with Monmouth County hosts paper shredding and recycling events.

When available, residents can bring a container and shovel to the recycling yard and take home composted material for your garden.

MARLBORO TOWNSHIP DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

The Department of Public Works (DPW) is responsible for the maintenance of all public property including roadways and infrastructure. Among many functions, the Department manages the recycling, leaf, brush and bulk waste collection programs, is responsible for the upkeep of park and recreation facilities and the removal of snow from roadways.

The Township is divided into zones for purposes of scheduling and delivering services in the most efficient manner possible. On an annual basis, DPW publishes this calendar of services.

The Township provides numerous leaf and brush removal in an unauthorized manner shall be required to remove the waste pickup dates, which means that debris is in or near our road and sidewalk areas during many months of the year. It is critical that all debris be placed for pickup in accordance with the published schedule and regulations of the Township. All collections must be placed on property near curb per schedule in calendar. After the pickup period has passed and the streets have been cleaned, no additional debris may be placed curbside until the

next scheduled pickup for your **zone**. Aside from detracting from the appearance of our Township, debris left in the streets impedes the flow of stormwater and exacerbates flood conditions. It causes traffic and safety hazards for pedestrians, bicyclists and motorists and interferes with snow removal during the winter months. Landscapers or residents placing debris for collection

from the public right of way. At any time of year, but especially during the winter, with leaf and brush removal coinciding with snow and ice accumulation, schedules necessarily become weather dependent. Complicating matters, trucks used for leaf and brush removal are also used for snow and ice removal. For example, trucks outfitted with sanders to treat the roadways cannot be utilized for leaf and brush pickup. As such, all curbside pickups are "Weather

Permitting". Based upon weather conditions and forecasts, the Office of Emergency Management (OEM) will determine if recycling, leaf, or brush collections will proceed according to the schedule. Residents will be notified in advance via Township email and social media if a collection will be postponed or cancelled, in which case no debris should be placed for collection.

New Jersey Clean Communities has served as a source of financial support for Township programs since 1986. Specifically, program dollars have been utilized to offset the cost of recycling park maintenance, road side cleanups, educational events and Community Pride Day. The Recycling Division Office also coordinates with volunteers to adopt and maintain areas of the Township. To "adopt a site" call Public COMMUNITY Works 732 536-0188, or email

- ♦ BATTERIES: Household batteries are to be put in the trash. Rechargeable Batteries and Cell Phone Batteries are accepted at certain retail stores such as Batteries Plus, Home Depot and Lowes. Call 877-2recycle or visit http://www.call2recycle.org/ for more information
- BRUSH: Picked up curbside as per schedule or may be dropped off at Recycling Center (see Brush collection) or Monmouth County Reclamation Center
- BULK TRASH "SPRING CLEAN-UP": Picked up curbside in spring but may be dropped off at Recycling Center. A free of charge bulk permit is required (See Bulk Trash).
- CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS: Not accepted at Town Recycling Center. Can be brought to County Reclamation center (see page 3) or curbside during bulk pickup.
- ELECTRONICS: Electronic items are accepted at the Recycling Center. No permit of fee. Includes TV, computer parts, almost anything with a plug.
- FLUORESCENT BULBS: Max of 5 bulbs may be dropped off at Recycling center. Certain retail stores like Batteries Plus, Home Depot and Lowes will accept.
- GRASS CLIPPINGS: Rutgers University recommends cutting grass and leaving it on the lawn. The Monmouth Reclamation Center, 6000 Asbury Avenue in Tinton Falls, 732-683-8686 accepts grass clippings and vegetative waste.
- ♦ HAZARDOUS WASTE: Includes paint, liquid gas, pesticides, car oil, car batteries and pool chemicals. Contact the Monmouth County Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Facility located at 3211 Shafto Road, Tinton Falls, 732-683-8686 ext.5210
- ♦ HOUSEHOLD TRASH-SOLID WASTE: Residents must independently contract for solid waste collection with a contractor that picks up in Marlboro like: Freehold Cartage 732-462-1001, M&S 732-471-8900, Marpal Disposal 732-542-2348, Solterra 732-727-0247
- LATEX PAINT: Dried out paint cans with lids removed may be disposed of with other household trash.
- LEAVES: Place in biodegradable paper bags for curbside pickup per schedule. May be dropped of at Town Recycling Center (see Leaf Collection) or County Reclamation center (see Page 3). Loose leaf pickup scheduled as per calendar (see calendar)
- ♦ MEDICAL WASTE OF "SHARPS" FROM THE HOME: Local Hospitals: CentraState 732-294-2574, Monmouth Medical 732-222-5200 and Jersey Shore Medical 732-776-4225.
- PLASTIC BAGS: Reuse when possible or recycle clean bags in bins provided at many retailers. Do NOT put curbside for recycling.
- PRESCRIPTION DRUGS: A drop box is available in the Marlboro Division of Police lobby, 1979 Township Drive, Justice Center. Open 24/7. Remove all personal identification information from labels before disposing. No sharps.
- PROPANE TANKS: Marlboro Recycling Center after valve has been left open for at least 24 hours.
- RECYCLABLES, COMINGLED: Comingled: NO plastic bags of any kind permitted curbside. Place cans, glass, bottles aluminum and plastic containers curbside in a rigid container-maximum 32 gallons. Mixed Paper: Bundle newspapers, magazines, cardboard, mixed paper. Picked up curbside or may be dropped off (see Recycling Collection)
- REFRIGERATORS: and freezers are recycled through the local utility. Go to www.firstenergycorp.com/save_energy/save_energy_new_jersey/for_your_home_nj/appliance-program.html, or call 1-888-740-8005. Appliances are also picked up curbside in spring during Bulk Pickup. Or may be dropped off at Recycling Center (see Bulk Trash)
- TIRES AND RIMS: maximum of 4 may be dropped off at Recycling Center. Tires and rims must be separated. A free of charge bulk permit is required (see Bulk Trash).

RECYCLING COLLECTION

The Department of Public Works contracts with a private company for curbside recycling services. Recyclables are collected every other week by recycling zone and should be placed at the curb by 7:00am on the specified collection day. No pickup on Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Years Day. Special pickup days are noted in the calendar.

Recyclable containers should be rinsed and placed together (commingled) in an unlined, rigid, reusable plastic container or garbage can, no larger than 32 gallons. Covers should not be attached and both receptacle and cover should be labeled "RECYCLE". Only items at curbside will be collected.

Plastic bags placed in recycling containers or recycling placed curbside in a plastic bag will prevent all recycling from being collected.

GUIDELINES

- Marlboro residents with proof of residency only (Driver's License or utility bill).
- No vehicles with commercial, farmer or dealer plates.
- Only clean recyclables are accepted at the Center.
- No items may be left outside the fence when the facility is closed.
- No hazardous materials, concrete, bricks or construction debris are accepted.
- Leaves must be emptied from non-biodegradable bags or containers.
- Brush must be bundled in accordance with Township regulations.
- Cardboard must be bundled in 2' x 2' x 1' stacks.
- Propane tanks must be emptied with valves open for at least 24 hours.

BULK TRASH PERMIT

A Bulk Permit (free of charge) is required to bring bulk trash to the Recycling Center. It can be easily obtained online at www.marlboro-nj.gov/documents/forms-permits-licenses - proof of residency required. Contact the Recycling office at 732-536-0188 Monday to Friday, 7:00am - 3:00pm or email publicworks@marlboro-nj.gov for more.

PUBLIC WORKS EMERGENCIES

The Recycling Center may close in the event of emergencies including snow or ice removal, and on holidays as noted in this calendar.

BULK/SPRING CLEAN-UP COLLECTION

The Department of Public Works contracts with a private company for the annual Spring Bulk Trash Collection and takes place by zone per schedule (see calendar). Place items on your property near curb, not in street. Items collected include household items such as sofas, chairs, tables, carpeting, refrigerators, washers, dryers, ovens, barbecue grills (without the propane tank) and toys. Items to be picked up must be placed neatly at the curb by 7:00am of the first scheduled pickup day. Once a street has been completed, the contractor will not return to that street.

ITEMS INCLUDED AND CONDITIONS:

- Appliances such as refrigerators, washers and dryers must have doors removed (note that the contractor may collect these items in a separate pickup).
- Fencing, decking and other discarded lumber must be cut to a maximum length of four (4) feet. Treated lumber will not be accepted.
- All containers and drums must have one end removed to ensure that no liquid, chemical or hazardous materials are present.
- Separate metal from other debris.
- No single item may weigh more than 300 pounds, and the total items placed at any residence must not exceed more than five (5) cubic yards. Do not combine your bulk with your neighbor's bulk.
- All metal and wood swing sets must be disassembled and concrete footings removed for pickup.
- Remove or hammer down all nails from wood/construction debris or fencing.

WEATHER PERMITTING

The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) will notify residents via email and social media whether or not collections will be suspended due to weather conditions, in which case no debris shall be placed curbside. Residents may bring bulk, leaves or brush to the Recycling Center. Refer to "Recycling Center Guidelines".

RESIDENTS MAY BRING BULK TRASH TO THE RECYCLING CENTER. SEE RECYCLING CENTER GUIDELINES.

BRUSH COLLECTION

Brush is to be placed curbside by 7:00am on the first day of the scheduled pickup week, free of leaves or other debris. Weather permitting, it generally takes approximately one week to complete each zone. Once a street has been completed, the Department of Public Works will not return to that street. For the safety of pedestrians and motorists, brush should be placed at the curb no earlier than one week prior to the first scheduled collection date.

All brush is to be cut to a maximum length of six (6) feet and a maximum diameter of four (4) inches and should not exceed fifty (50) pounds in weight. Branches less than one inch in diameter shall be tied in neat bundles no more than four (4) feet in length and two (2) feet across. The total amount placed for any single collection shall be no more than ten (10) cubic yards or three (3) feet by three (3) feet by thirty (30) feet. Brush comingled with leaves, grass, rocks, stumps, construction debris, fence posts, etc., trash or recyclables will not be collected.

NEVER BLOW OR PLACE LEAVES OR BRUSH IN STREET

Leaves and brush may not be blown or placed in the street or block the right-of-way. It can cause flooding, traffic safety issues and is dangerous for pedestrians, motorcycles and bicyclists.

LEAF COLLECTION

2022 leaf pickups will be bagged or piled as per schedule below. Biodegradable Paper Leaf Bags are available through our Department of Public Works at no charge (SEE PAGE 21). NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER PICKUP SCHEDULE TO BE ANNOUNCED.

FOR SCHEDULE UPDATES GO TO MARLBORO-NJ.GOV REGISTER FOR EMAIL NOTICE

Leaves to be picked up must be placed on your property near the curb, not in street, by 7am on the first day of the scheduled period for your zone per dates indicated. Leaves commingled with brush or other debris will not be picked up. After a zone has been completed, the Roads Department will not return for late curbside placement. Homeowners and landscapers must follow schedule and leaf pickup regulations and are responsible for the removal of leaves if schedule and rules are not followed. Per NJDEP regulations and Township ordinance (Chapter 320, Section 15: 320 15) Violations of schedule/ regulations as specified are subject to penalties.

NOTE: Weather patterns, wind, rain and snow impact leaf collection. Loose leaves spread on roads and properties, block storm drains, exacerbate flooding, icing, and road hazards, and cause an unsightly mess which can blow back onto neighborhood lawns. Decomposing leaves in streets cause excess nitrogen and phosphorus in the runoff to waterways, contributing to algae blooms having an adverse effect on water ecosystems and waterfront economies. These rules are critical for quality of life and public safety.

2. What happens if I put items out after the scheduled pick up date?

Recyclables, bulk trash, leaves and brush may be brought to the Municipal Recycling Center or you may contact a private hauler.

3. What should I do if my recycling collection is missed?

If you placed your recyclables curbside prior to 7:00am on your scheduled pick up day and recyclables are not collected by 5:00pm, call the Recycling Office at 732-536-9295 or email publicworks@marlboro-nj.gov with a photo if possible. This helps us to determine why your recycling was left behind.

4. How do I obtain a bulk trash permit?

Residents are permitted to bring bulk trash to the Recycling Center. A free of charge bulk trash permit is required. Permits can be easily obtained online at https://www.marlboro-nj.gov/documents/forms-permits-licenses. Proof of residency required. Contact the Recycling office Monday through Friday, 7:30am to 3:00pm. Call 732-536-0188 or email publicworks@marlboro-nj.gov. Refer to "Recycling Center Guidelines".

5. Who do I call if my street light is out? Street lights are owned and operated by Jersey Central Power and Light (JCP&L). JCP&L can be reached at 1-888-LIGHTSS (888-544-4877)

NJ PLASTIC REGULATIONS - EFFECTIVE MAY 4, 2022

In an effort to curtail the detriments presented by single use plastics, the New Jersey Senate and General Assembly have enacted regulations that ban many forms of single use plastic. Despite recycling efforts, which remain as important as ever, the legislature found that country wide, under 10% of plastic finds its way to being recycled. Most ends up in landfills, incinerators, or in waterways and oceans. In addition to this legislation, Marlboro Township remains committed to vigorous recycling efforts as described in this publication.

Starting May 4, 2022, New Jersey retail stores, grocery stores and food service businesses may not provide or sell single-use plastic carryout bags and polystyrene foam food service products. Single-use paper carryout bags are allowed to be provided or sold, except by grocery stores equal to or larger than 2500 square feet, which may only provide or sell reusable carryout bags. After November 4, 2021, plastic straws may be provided only upon the request of the customer.

EXEMPTIONS FROM PLASTIC AND PAPER CARRYOUT BAG AND PLASTIC STRAW BANS:

- Bags used to contain uncooked meat, fish or poultry.
- Bags used to package loose items.
- Bags used to contain live animals.
- Bags used to contain food sliced or prepared to order, including soup and hot food.
- Laundry, dry cleaning or garment bags.
- Bags provided by a pharmacy to carry prescriptions.
- Newspaper bags.
- Any similar bag, as determined by the Department (DEP)
- Sale packs of paper bags and paper leaf bags.
- Sale of packs plastic straws, straws with juice box.

EXEMPTIONS FROM THE BAN ON POLYSTYRENE FOAM FOOD SERVICE PRODUCTS (ALL EXPIRE MAY 4, 2024):

- Disposable, long-handled polystyrene foam soda spoons when required and used for thick drinks.
- Portion cups of 2 oz. or less, if used for hot foods or foods requiring lids.
- Meat and fish trays for raw or butchered meat, including poultry, or fish that is sold from a refrigerator or similar retail appliance.
- Any food product pre-packaged by the manufacturer with a polystyrene foam food service product.
- Any other polystyrene foam food service product as determined necessary by the DEP.

I am pleased to include our Surviving the Snow brochure in our calendar arriving to homes every winter. It is a continuation of Plan and Prepare included within previous annual mailings and available on the Marlboro Township Website. Unpredictable weather conditions and unusual snow fall has become a regular part of New Jersey winters and this brochure offers tips and information on Surviving the Snow whether it is an early November light powder, a mid December ice storm or a late March heavy slush.

Our Department of Public Works is on the job day and night when expecting severe weather of any kind, with countless hours of prep before, and time in the field during and after a snow event. Snow is challenging and Marlboro Township has been a leader in keeping over 200 miles of roadway clear and safe. Our bagged leaf program has been initiated due to recent weather patterns where wind, rain and snow have impacted collection dates, spreading leaves on the roads and neighboring properties as well as blocking storm drains resulting in flooding, icing and road hazards. Your safety is our first concern.

We are fortunate to have volunteer 1st Aid Squads, Fire Departments and a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), as well as a Police Department that is always ready to assist. For non-emergency situations, please call Marlboro Police at 732-536-0100. Always dial 911 for emergencies. Be assured that if you have an emergency, our teams will get to you, even if your street or driveway has yet to be cleared.

Please help by following the tips provided here, keeping informed and helping your friends and neighbors to do the same. Visit our website and register to receive news by phone, email and follow us on social media. If you do not have a computer you may register your phones by calling (732) 536-0100 ext. 1412.

SNOW REMOVAL RULES

- No debris, including leaves, brush, garbage cans, basketball hoops shall be left in road. Anything In the road during snow event impedes Township's ability to clear streets, increases risk of damage to property and jeopardizes safety of equipment operators.
- When snow is on the way, all vehicles and obstructions must be removed from the roadways.
- Snow may not be shoveled, blown or plowed into the roadways.
 SNOW REMOVAL FACTS
- Marlboro is 32.5 square miles and DPW is responsible for clearing over 200 miles of roadway. Private contractors are also secured.
- Roads are generally treated with de-icing agents two times during one storm event, prior to and following snow removal.
- DPW opens roads on the first pass and then plows curb- to-curb.
- In the event of 4 inches of snowfall, it takes approximately 10 hours to complete one circuit through the Township.

SNOW REMOVAL TIPS

- Wait until DPW has made one pass before clearing driveway.
- Parking vehicles in your driveway gives you less snow to remove and a drier surface.
- Arrange cars so that the first car that has to get out is the last parked in your driveway.
- When clearing snow, where possible, pile the snow to the right of the driveway (looking out to the street from your house).
- The United States Postal Service asks customers to clear enough snow from their mailboxes to allow mail trucks to approach the box, deliver the mail and drive away.
- Fire hydrants located on your property should be cleared of snow to prevent the lines from freezing and allow access in case of fire.
- To report a mailbox damaged during snow removal activities, please notify DPW via email publicworks@marlboro-nj.gov.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Marlboro Township is 32.5 square miles and

our Department of Public Works (DPW) is responsible for over 200 miles of roads. This does not include State and County roads or roads in private developments.

Roads are treated twice during a storm event; before and after melt and re-freeze, and may be treated a third time if over 24 hours.

It takes about 10 hours for DPW to clear a 4" **snowfall**. More snow takes proportionately more time. For example, it will take about 20 hours to clear an 8" snowstorm.

All vehicles and any obstruction must be removed from the street to allow for snowplow access.

Do not shovel or blow snow into roadway. This causes a hazardous condition and is a violation of Marlboro Township Ordinances.

Parking on driveway will decrease the amount of snow to shovel and allow for a drier surface when pulling out. Park vehicles on your driveway so that the first car that has to get out is the last one parked.

Property Damage, such as basketball hoops, hockey nets, potted plants, etc. that are damaged during snow removal are NOT the responsibility of Marlboro Township. Remove such items prior to snow fall. If Damage to your Mailbox occurs during plowing, please call Public Works at 732-536-0188.

Please be aware that snowplows will deposit snow at the end of your driveway. As plows drive by, snow will fall into an empty space. To lessen the volume, wait to shovel or leave 4 feet of snow at end of your driveway until after the snowplows have completed at least one pass.

> **REPORT POWER** OUTAGES TO JCP&L AT 1-888-LIGHTSS

Freezing Rain - Rain that freezes when it hits the ground, roads, walkways, trees and power lines.

Sleet - Rain that turns to ice pellets before reaching the ground. Sleet causes roads to become slippery.

KNOW THE **TERMS**

Winter Weather Advisory - Winter weather conditions are expected to cause significant inconveniences and may be hazardous.

Winter Storm Watch - A winter storm is possible in your area. Tune in to NOAA Weather Radio, commercial radio, or television for more information.

Winter Storm Warning - A winter storm is occurring or will soon occur in your area.

Blizzard Warning - Sustained winds or frequent gusts to at least 35 miles per hour, falling or blowing snow, reduced visibility conditions lasting 3 or more hours.

Frost/Freeze Warning - Below freezing temperatures are expected.

Before winter approaches, add these supplies to your emergency kit and assure that these are accessible in extreme snow conditions:

Rock salt or more environmentally safe products to melt ice on walkways. Visit the Environmental Protection Agency for a complete list of recommended products.

SUPPLY YOUR HOME

Sand to improve traction.

Snow shovels and other snow removal equipment.

Sufficient heating fuel. You

may become isolated in your home and regular fuel sources may be cut off. Store a good supply of dry, seasoned wood for your fireplace or wood -burning stove.

Adequate Clothing and Blankets for warmth.

Water Proof Gloves and Boots on hand.

Weather Sealing Tape to temporarily address drafts or broken windows due to storm damage.

Flash Lights, Batteries and Portable Chargers in case of power outage.

CHECK YOUR CAR

Check or have a mechanic check your car: Antifreeze levels, battery and ignition system, brakes, exhaust system (carbon monoxide is deadly and usually gives no warning), fuel (a full tank prevents fuel line from freezing), air filters, heater and

defrost, lights and hazards, oil (heavier oils may congeal in cold and may not lubricate as well), thermostat, Windshield wipers, good winter tires - (consider chains or studded snow tires). Have on hand: scraper, portable shovel, sand and/or salt, snacks, boots, warm gloves, car lock de-icer.


