GENERAL INFORMATION

- Marlboro Township Recreation programs are open to all Marlboro Township residents. Select programs are available to non-residents.
- Children must be currently enrolled in an accredited kindergarten program or higher grade in September 2019 to be eligible to participate, unless other age minimum is stated.
- Each participant must be fully registered (including payment of registration fee) to be eligible to participate in any program.
- The Recreation Department reserves the right to cancel any program. Refund requests must be emailed to the Recreation Department recreation@marlboro-nj.gov
- Processing fee consisting of a minimum of \$5 or 20% of the amount to be refunded, whichever is greater, to a maximum of \$25 which will be charged on all refunds except for cancellations initiated by the Township. This processing fee shall not be construed to supplant or override any nonrefundable deposit applicable to a particular program.
- No refund once program begins.
- Financial assistance is available for those that qualify. Please contact the administrative clerk at 732-617-0100 or email Erechtman@marlboro-nj.gov for a financial assistance application.
- <u>INCLEMENT WEATHER</u>: If schools are closed during the day, no recreation programs will be held. Every attempt will be made to make up canceled sessions, but cannot guarantee that all canceled sessions will be made up.
- The Recreation Department reserves the right to suspend any individual enrolled in a program for disciplinary reasons. Neither partial nor full refund will be made.
- Questions may be directed to the Recreation Office at 732-617-0100 between 8:00am and 4:30pm, Monday through Friday.
- Credit cards (Visa or MC), checks, or money orders made payable to Marlboro Recreation will be accepted. DO NOT SEND CASH.

RECREATION SUMMER CAMPS



CAMP DATES: JUNE 29th-AUGUST 7th Summer Day Camp (Current K-6th Grade)

The Marlboro Township's Recreation Summer Day Camp is set up into 2, 3-week sessions. You have the option of signing up for a three-week session or for all six weeks. The program runs Monday through Friday, approximately 9:00am to 3:00 pm. There is no camp on July 3rd.

Our program is located in Board of Education Schools throughout the Township. All camp sites are fully staffed with Site Directors, Activity Instructors, Group Leaders, Art Instructors, EMT and Counselors. The staff ranges from high school students to adults. The camper to staff ratio is 8:1 for younger campers, and 10:1 for older campers.

Daily on-site activities include sports & games, arts & crafts, "theme days", races & contests, camper/group of the week awards, and much more. Several times each week, all campers and staff are bussed to our Aquatic Center. There each camper can swim and play in our "zero depth" pool (0' to 5'), play under the refreshing spray features, laugh on one of the two water slides, or just relax with friends by the pool. The facility includes athletic fields and courts, a concession stand (with nut-free products), playground area, and plenty of shade to keep cool. Several times during the summer, your child's camp site will go on a trip. We go to local bowling alleys, amusement parks, area movies and more by bus. **All fees are included in registration.**

Theater & Arts Camp (Current 4th-8th Grade)

Bring your talent and creativity to the stage. Join our camp that offers the chance to experience every aspect of the theater. Whether you can sing and dance, act or want to be behind the scenes doing lighting, sound and set design, you can do a little bit of everything. Each of the two sessions will produce a unique production for friends & family.

Teen Travel Camp (Current 7th & 8th Grade)

Campers will be transported via coach buses to enjoy some summertime fun visiting some of the Tri-State Area's most exciting attractions. They will spend their days at water and amusement parks, tubing down the Delaware River, taking in sporting events, visiting some of Jersey's beautiful beaches, and so much more. Camper to staff ratio is 12:1.

General Camp Info

Registration

Children must be 4 years of age for Swim Camp or 8 years of age for Sports or Activities Camp prior to the first day of camp (June 29th) in order to be eligible for this summer. No exceptions will be made.

Payment

The \$100 non-refundable deposit is due when you register. The remaining balance must be received no later than May 1st or your child's spot will be forfeited.

ID Cards

For security reasons an ID card is required any time you enter the facility. Therefore any camper or any adult entering for the day camp program must present their ID at the front gate to gain access into the facility. If you do not have an ID card you may be denied entrance into the swim club.

Swim Camp (Ages 4-9 years old)

The Marlboro Swim Club Day Camp is a 7-week program that runs Monday through Friday from 11:00 am to 4:00pm. Campers must be between the ages of 4 and 9 years old. Daily activities include recreational pool time, playground activities, sports, arts and crafts, themed weeks, and more! You'll see new events on the 2020 calendar this year!! Swim with a mermaid and swim lessons will be NEW this year for the Swim Club Day Camp. Parents will receive a calendar of events prior to the season and will receive reminders during the season so that no campers miss out on the fun. Swim lessons will be included in the camp price. Lessons will be 2 days of week for 6 weeks. ALL campers will be involved in Color Wars and our end of the year Camp Show.

Our camps are held solely on the ground of the swim club and are staffed with adult supervisors, counselors, and an on-site EMT. Each grade level has a supervisor and counselor to camper ratio depends on the group size and age. For our younger campers our minimum ratio is 6:1. For our older campers our minimum ratio is 8:1.

FEE: \$740 (Rates remain the same as 2019 through April 1st)

No Camp will be held on July 3rd

Sports Camp (Ages 8- 12 years old)

For children ages 8-12 we offer a camp with a complete emphasis on sports. This camp is held within the swim club grounds but also utilizes the facilities adjacent to the club. We have access to basketball courts, tennis courts, wall ball courts, soccer fields, and baseball fields.

During this 7-week program campers will learn and develop a variety of motor skills that can help improve their game. Our supervisors and counselors create schedules that incorporate time to work on individual skills, team building, and game knowledge. Once campers acquire an understanding of these components they will move on to competitive games. Throughout the camp season there will be various individual and team awards given to our campers who are improving, working hard, and showing good sportsmanship!

Not only will be the 2020 Summer Olympics be held in Tokyo this year, we will be hosting our own version of the 2020 Summer Olympics at the Marlboro Swim Club Sports Camp. We are also looking forward to having Marlboro Mustang High School Athletes to come instruct and play games with the campers. ALL campers will be involved in Color Wars and our end of the year Camp Show.

Campers will follow schedules throughout the day and will have specific times set for lunch, recreational games, and swimming. These campers will also be scheduled to attend the events that come to camp.

Fee: \$765 (Rates remain the same as 2019 prices through April 1st)

Non-Residents pay an additional \$100

Activities Camp (Ages 8- 12 years old)

For ages 8-12, we offer a program that engages our campers in arts and crafts, coloring, dream catchers, tie dying, backpack and jewelry making, scrapbooking, karaoke, "salon days", music and dance. These campers will also have a Camp Art show at the end of the year to display all the work they have done throughout the summer.

These campers will also have the opportunity to swim, play sports, create scavenger hunts, and participate in other camp events. Our activities camp will play an important role in our End of Camp Show and will participate in camp Color War.

Fee: \$765 (Rates remain the same as 2019 prices through April 1st)

Non-Residents pay an additional \$100

Parent Notifications

For the safety of each camper and for the safety of our swim club members, parents and guardians of campers will not be permitted to enter the circle to drop off or pick up a camper. Emergency vehicles need to be able to access the circle if necessary. You MUST park in the parking lot and walk into the facility. Failure to follow this policy may result in the camper being asked to leave the camp and forfeiture of all fees paid.

Drop off Time: Camp begins at 11AM. Please do not drop off your child before that time unless they are in our before camp program.

<u>Pick up Time</u>: Day camp ends promptly at 4:00 PM. All campers must be picked up by this time. The Swim Club staff is unavailable to watch campers if parents pick up their children late. For any parents who are frequently late, the swim club may charge a late fee or dismiss your child from the day camp.

For any information regarding closures of camp, parents will be notified via Community Pass.

If you are not receiving Community Pass notifications please check your account and make sure your correct email has been answered. Please contact the Day Camp Director with any issues.

Delayed Openings

If morning weather conditions consist of lightning and thunder but indications exist that it may clear after mid-morning we will have a delayed opening and begin camp at 1pm. If the rain does not clear camp will not be held. You will be notified via Community Pass or email.

Camp Closing

To ensure the safety of your child, if a steady thunderstorm begins when camp is in session we will take the campers inside our pavilion or bathhouses. Depending on the severity of the rain and overall weather conditions camp may be closed for the day. If camp is closed for the day parents are responsible for picking up their child from the facility.

Please be aware of the weather and in the area should there be inclement weather.
